

A 20-Year Journey Unraveling the Mysteries of the Eastern Golden Eagle

For almost two decades, Dr. Trish Miller and colleagues have tracked over 120 Golden Eagles in eastern North America. Their tracking studies have provided insight into the ecology, genetics, distribution, and behavior of this species throughout the annual cycle. Notably, their research has used high resolution



GPS data to understand how eagles fly and respond to their environment and how those responses may put them at risk from collision with wind turbines. Their body of work has provided invaluable insights into the enigmatic eastern population of Golden Eagles and were the basis for the recently published Eastern Golden Eagle Conservation Plan.
