#### **ABA Faculty Awarded Nearly \$400K in Grants**

For more than 40 years, the mission of the Robert Wood Johnson Foundation (RWJF) has been to improve the health and health care of all Americans. This year, the Rowan ABA faculty are integrating behavior analysis into that mission. MaryLouise Kerwin, Michelle Soreth, and Bethany Raiff are recipients of 4 out of 10 RWJF Health Care Delivery Seed Funding Grants. Rowan's Office of Research provides competitively awarded funding to Glassboro-campus full-time faculty investigators with the aim of supporting preliminary efforts towards establishing new and innovative research and cultivating interdisciplinary research partnerships between the Rowan School of Osteopathic Medicine (SOM) in Stratford, the main campus of Rowan University in Glassboro, and the Cooper Medical School of Rowan University in Camden (CMSRU). During her time at Caldwell, the graduate program expanded from post-baccalaureate to Masters, and then ultimately to Ph.D. Dr. Kerth hopes to apply what she learned during her experience of this process to Rowan's Graduate programs in ABA. Dr. Kerth has worked in the field of behavior analysis for 13 years serving children and adolescents with autism, developmental disabilities, severe problem behavior,

New Application Packet Requirement Effective January 1, 2015, the BACB will require all applicants for examination to send their supporting documentation (e.g., documentation of degree, coursework, experience, college teaching, BCBA Reviews, CVs, etc.) in one single, complete submission. envelope.

# Revised Ethics Code Introduced

The BACB's new ethics code is titled. Professional and Ethical Compliance Code for Behavior Analysts ("the Code") and is available online. The Code, which includes 72 different elements in 10 sections, updates and consolidates the current Conduct Guidelines and Disciplinary Standards. Effective January 1, 2016, the Code will replace the Conduct Guidelines and Disciplinary Standards. From that time forward, the Code will serve as the BACB's guidance to the field on ethical matters and as the basis for disciplinary complaints.

A number of other changes to BACB standards will soon take effect in a variety of areas including: experience requirements, supervisor qualifications, degree requirements, continuing education, among others. Please refer to the table below and check out the website for more in-depth information.

In July 2013, Dr. MaryLouise Kerwin was awarded a 2-year, \$394,000 pilot grant from the New Jersey Governor's Council for Medical Research and Treatment of Autism and the New Jersey Department of Health to study parent-implemented interventions for autism. The high prevalence rates of the expand research in autism autism and intensive time reauirements for intervention have resulted in a need for the development of innovative service delivery models. Dr. Kerwin's research team, including fellow faculty member Dr. Michelle Soreth, several expert consultants, and over 20 graduate and undergraduate students, is in the process of evalu- Center for Behavior Analysis,

ating the effectiveness of several popular interventions specifically designed for implementation by parents. The results of the pilot study may provide the required preliminary data for a successful grant application to the National Institute of Health, which would allow the team to treatment at Rowan and offer families affected by autism opportunities to access highquality supplemental treatment services and trainings at no cost.

Dr. Kerwin's project is the first Governor's Council for Autism grant awarded to Rowan University, and allows for Rowan's Psychology Department, and behavior analytic faculty to continue to receive regional, state, and national attention for autism treatment and the training of future behavior analysts.
