

Subject: Neurodiversity and college mental health postgraduate fellowship

Good morning! We have a unique postgraduate fellowship opportunity focusing on neurodiversity and college mental health. We are accepting applicants for 2022-2023. We would welcome candidates from doctoral programs in Clinical, Counseling, and School Psychology, and from Master's programs in Mental Health Counseling. Thank you in advance for sharing!

The Dolce Postgraduate Fellowship at Iona College Counseling Center is a **full-time appointment for one or two years, depending on the candidate's licensure requirements**, beginning and ending in mid-August. The Dolce Fellowship offers the opportunity to develop expertise in neurodiversity and college mental health, while earning the necessary supervised hours toward New York State licensure. In a caring, balanced environment, Fellows deliver individual therapy services addressing a broad range of clinical needs, and focus primarily on neurodiverse students.

The Dolce Fellowship offers extensive experience in direct clinical practice, supervision, and outreach, with full integration into the professional Counseling Center team. The Fellow delivers short-term psychotherapy to the students of Iona College, and conducts intake assessments, consultation, and crisis intervention. The Fellow is the instructor of a psychoeducational course focusing on social skills and emotion awareness. The Fellow designs and delivers targeted outreach programs to neurodiverse students, conducts faculty and student leader training, and provides tailored consultation to members of the campus community related to student mental health concerns. The Fellow works with neurodiverse student groups to facilitate creation of community and connectedness on campus. The Fellow receives intensive individual and group supervision, and participates in weekly didactic seminars. In addition, the Fellow has the option to provide both individual and group supervision to graduate externs and to receive secondary supervision from licensed staff.

Health, vision and dental benefits, paid vacation and sick time, time blocked to study for licensing exam during student breaks and summer session, structured work week with time built in for documentation, beautiful campus and vibrant community, free parking on campus, free shuttle from local Metro North train station to campus.
